#### PRESIDENT'S CORNER

Our 94th Oyster Roast - This year marks our 94th Oyster and Bull Roast—having to miss two years for Covid and one year during WWII. These oyster roasts began years ago as a friendly get-to-know your neighbors affair. They were held on the lawns of different residents, but the weather often presented difficulties. Sixty-one years ago, October 11, 1962, the oyster roast was moved to the new Loveless Civic Center, where we still gather today.

This event requires a tremendous amount of work and time to organize and generate. Thank you to all the volunteers who have signed up this year to help on the day of this event. As I mentioned before, there is a great deal of prepping, before this event, with County licensing, food vendors, oyster shuckers, tickets, wristbands etc. But I would like to give a special "shout out" to Terri Sisk who has run our kitchen for this event for many, many years. She works tirelessly in the kitchen for the entire event and long after most of us have left. Thank you, Terri for your dedication and love to this community.

#### September 16, 2023, Membership Meeting

Special Guest Speaker Bartlett Tree Experts Arborist Eli Walker. Following the discussion of tree decline in Holland Point at the July 13th HPCA membership meeting, HPCA invited arborist, Eli Walker, to speak to the membership. Eli knows our region and its trees well, having moved here in 2020 from Bartlett Tree Experts Atlanta region to join their Southern Maryland team.

The number one stressor to our trees, particular the oaks, is climate: the speed of climate change; drought – the current rainfall deficit for the trees is over 14 inches; and milder winters affecting tree dormancy, which they need. Stressed trees excrete ethanol (the intoxicating agent found in beer, wine and liquor), which in turn attracts insects such as ambrosia beetles. Ambrosia beetles are very tiny, five to ten of them fit on a pinhead. They may be small, but they can kill a tree in a matter of a few months. If you find really fine sawdust collecting at the base of tree, that is a sign of ambrosia beetles and it's usually too late to save the tree.

The best approach to keeping trees healthy is long term health management provided by a licensed arborist: Soil sampling to look for nutrient deficiency such as iron or manganese; deep root fertilizing; and judicious pruning.

Eli also reminded our membership that Anne Arundel County requires a permit to remove any tree in the Chesapeake Bay Critical Area. Fines are steep for failing to obtain the required permit.

Key Takeaways from the HPCA Board of Directors and Membership Meeting:

**Speed Enforcement and Community Policing:** Residents may have noticed that the speed monitoring device at the Loveless Center was removed earlier this month by the County. It's no surprise that nearby residents noticed drivers slowing down while the device was in place and now that it's gone, speeding up. The HPCA Board is reviewing various options including acquiring a speed monitoring device.

Our HPCA-paid police officer had a busy month: 18 traffic stops, 56 citations/warnings; and 28 no parking citations/warnings. The four-month trial period for the police officer ends in November. The HPCA Board is gathering data and assessing whether to continue with this arrangement through the Winter months or break until Spring.

Long Range Planning Committee: HPCA's Long Range Planning Committee will meet with State Highway Administration ("SHA") staff Kellie Boulware at the Loveless Civic Center on Thursday, October 12th at 6:30 PM for an update on SHA projects. A key topic will include the state of Walnut Ave., including the ditches. As you no doubt have noticed, we are still awaiting the promised ditch clearing on the west side of Walnut Ave. The monthly HPCA membership meeting has been deferred to the following Thursday (October 19th). HPCA and Rose Haven residents are welcome to attend this meeting.

Congratulations to Rich Erickson: The Anne Arundel County Commission voted on the appointment of Rich Erickson to the Region 9 Stake Holder Advisory Committee ("SAC"). The County received 45 applications for the SAC and Rich was one of only a few selected. The first meeting of the Region 9 SAC will be on October 14th in Millersville. Future Region 9 SAC meeting dates will be posted on the respective Region Plan Hub Site (<a href="www.aacounty.org/region9">www.aacounty.org/region9</a>) under the heading Committee.
